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Core Flows for Daily Briefs

Define the data sources feeding your daily brief. Specify what to automate, what to review, and what requires human approval.

Key move Pilot with one critical service for two weeks and measure time-to-decision.

PRACTICAL CHECKLIST

- 01** Ingest incidents, alerts, outages, backlog items, and priorities from monitoring, ITSM, and project tools (e.g., PagerDuty).
- 02** Capture fields: timestamp, owner, severity, incident ID, priority, deadlines.
- 03** AI summarizes status, risks, blockers, actions, owners, and deadlines.
- 04** Establish escalation and on-call routing rules for missed thresholds.
- 05** Set guardrails: human-in-the-loop for high-severity items.
- 06** Security and access: least-privilege data access and auditing.
- 07** Adoption roadmap: Week 1 connect data source; Week 2 assign owners; Week 3 pilot summaries; Week 4 scale.

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Data-to-Decision Flows

Defines how data becomes a daily brief with AI augmentation. Outlines data sources, AI prompts, and governance.

Key move **Prototype with a single service; run a 7-day digest and compare manual vs AI-led decisions.**

PRACTICAL CHECKLIST

- 01** List data sources: monitoring, incident, backlog, change events, and performance dashboards.
- 02** Define required fields: timestamp, owner, severity, priority, deadlines.
- 03** Create concise AI prompts to summarize status and actions.
- 04** Establish escalation and on-call routing rules for missed thresholds.
- 05** Set guardrails: human-in-the-loop for high-severity items.
- 06** Security and access: least-privilege data access and auditing.
- 07** Adoption plan: Week 1 connect data source; Week 2 assign owners; Week 3 pilot summaries; Week 4 scale.

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Guardrails, Ownership, and Metrics

Governance defines ownership, approvals, and risk controls. It also sets how success is measured and iterated.

Key move Document ownership and approval steps in a single, visible runbook.

PRACTICAL CHECKLIST

- 01** Assign a single owner per service or backlog item to ensure accountability.
- 02** Require human sign-off for high-severity incidents and policy changes.
- 03** Define risk flags: data gaps, conflicting priorities, or automation errors.
- 04** Security/compliance: enforce data access controls and audit trails.
- 05** Metrics: time-to-decision, accuracy of summaries, and user adoption trends.
- 06** Review cadence: daily brief snapshots, weekly governance review, quarterly audits.
- 07** Adoption plan: allocate 1 hour weekly for people to refine prompts.
