## PRACTICAL CHECKLIST

- 01** Auto-group spend by supplier and category from ERP, AP, and invoices.
- 02** Surface supplier concentration/monopoly risk across top vendors.
- 03** Detect price variation for similar goods across suppliers with comparable terms.
- 04** Flag unmanaged or non-contracted purchases for review and policy adherence.
- 05** Surface negotiation opportunities from contract gaps and volume discounts.
- 06** Human review required for policy exceptions, high-risk contracts, and outliers.
- 07** Ensure data quality, taxonomy consistency, and access controls before automation.

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# Data, Tools & Roles

**Key move** Pilot on top 20 suppliers to validate data flows.

## PRACTICAL CHECKLIST

- 07** Data refresh cadence: nightly or weekly depending on data maturity.

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# Roadmap, Risks, and Ownership

**Key move** Governance sign-off before any automated spend classification.

## PRACTICAL CHECKLIST

- 01** Ownership: Finance Ops leads automation; category teams provide policy and exceptions.
- 02** Approvals: automated triggers require manager sign-off for high-value or risky spends.
- 03** Guardrails: limit data access, enforce privacy, and log all AI actions.
- 04** Risks: misclassification, data leakage, model drift, and over-reliance.
- 05** Measurement: baseline vs. savings, cycle time, and data quality scores.
- 06** Weekly adoption steps: Week 1 map data sources; Week 2 configure grouping rules; Week 3 run pilot; Week 4 review outcomes.
- 07** Decision gates: approval must happen before production rollout; document learnings and adjust.
